It is probably an idea to head to the evening venue at about 17:00. There is a football match at Parc des Princes that evening so it will start to get crowded round the area.

It takes about **45 minutes by Metro** to get to the evening venue and an hour by bus (the easiest way to get there for those in wheelchairs)

Directions to the evening venue la Pena Festayres , Parvis Cité des Sciences, 32 avenue Corentin Cariou Paris 19ème

By Metro:

- Take **line 9** from **Porte de Saint Cloud** to **Chaussée d'Antin (La Fayette)**
- Change on to **line 7 (pink)** (towards La Courneuve 8 Mai 1945) to **Corentin Cariou**

The journey should take about 45 minutes.

By Bus

- You need to get bus PC1
Direction : PORTE DE CHAMPERRET
from : PORTE DE SAINT CLOUD-MICHEL ANGE
to : PORTE MAILLOT-PALAIS DES CONGRES
- Change at : PORTE MAILLOT-PERSHING - Bus RATP
Then Bus PC3
Direction : PORTE DES LILAS
from : PORTE MAILLOT-PERSHING
to : PORTE DE LA VILLETTE-CORENTIN CARIOU

This journey should take about an hour.

The price is **32 euros**, you will be paying the restaurant direct so it would be an **idea to have the correct money with you.**

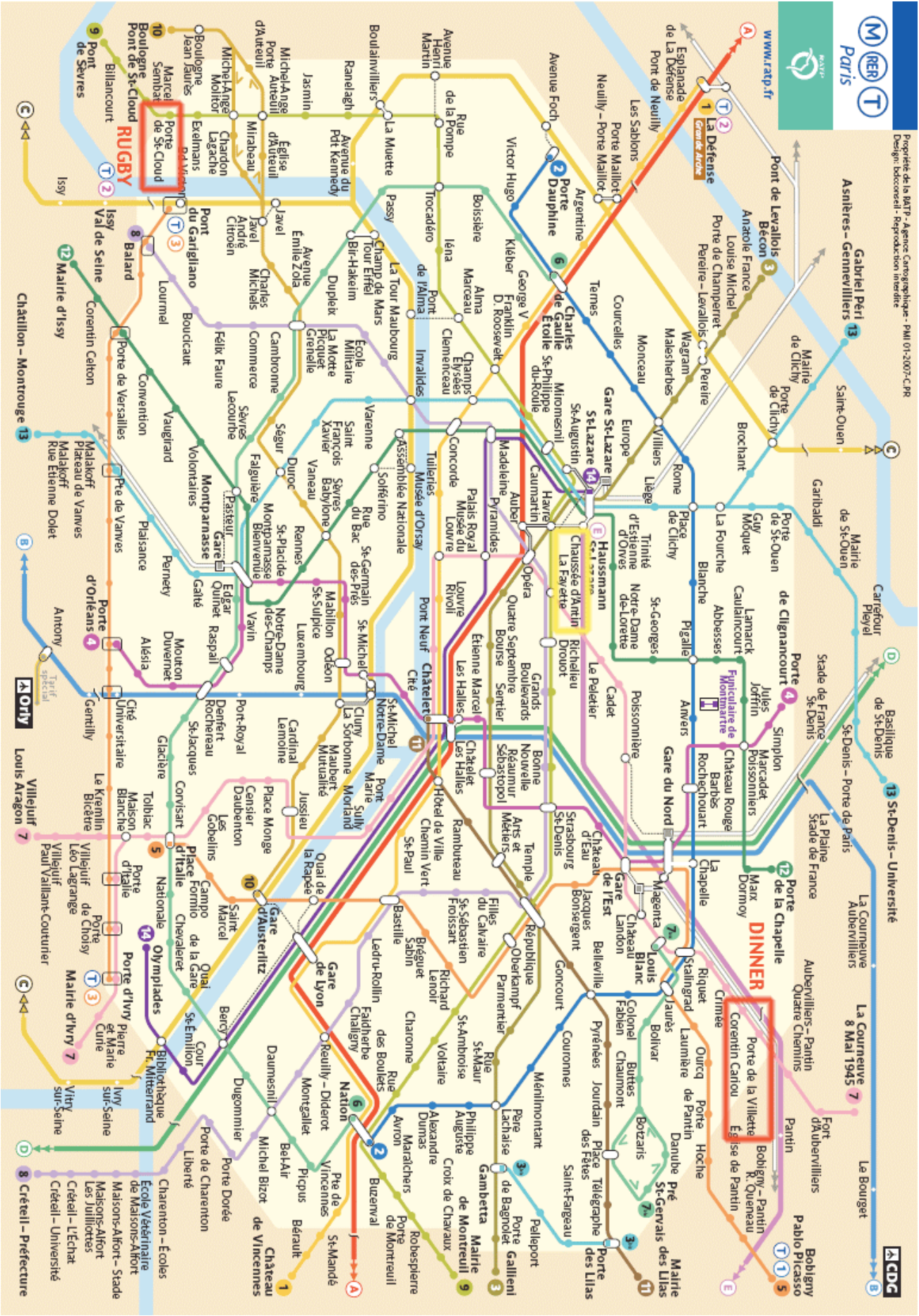
Please note: The last Metro back into the centre of Paris is at 1:30am

There is nothing planned for the Sunday except for recovering from the night before, but here are a couple of suggestions:

Armistice Day, citywide. The signing of the controversial document that ended World War I is celebrated with a military parade from the Arc de Triomphe to the Hôtel des Invalides. November 11.

Fête d'Art Sacré (Festival of Sacred Art). A series of classical concerts is held in five of the oldest churches of Paris. For details, call tel. 01-44-70-64-10. Mid-November to mid-December.

The Festival d'Automne (Autumn Festival. 01-53-45-17-00. www.festival-automne.com) has been going strong since 1972, bringing all sorts of arts events to the capital. The fine-arts exhibits and dance, theater, and music performances all focus on emerging and international artists.
